

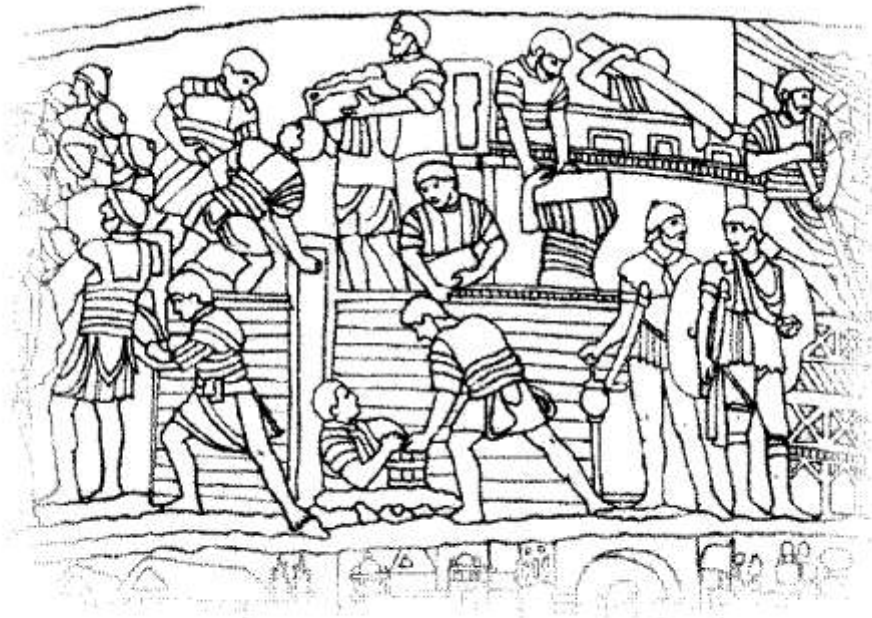
ROMAN COLUMN ACTIVITY

Groups of 3 or 4

Step 1: Learn about the topic of your column. Read your chosen section from Chapter 14. It must not be the same section you used to write your rap. Take detailed notes on your assigned section. These notes will be graded for accuracy and thoroughness.

Step 2: Write inscriptions for your column. Each partner must write an inscription at the bottom of their page that describes a key event or development from your chosen section. For example, an inscription might say, "Pax Romana begins under Augustus." Another example is, "Hannibal crosses the Alps with elephants." Make sure your inscriptions are written in your own words, are historically accurate, and free of spelling and grammatical errors.

Step 3: Illustrate your column. Above each inscription, each group member should make sketches to represent the inscription. The drawings should have a formal look, similar to the example below. Verify that the drawings clearly represent the ideas in the inscriptions. COLOR!

Step 4: Assemble your column. Tape your sections into a cylinder. Assemble all sections of your column into one complete column. Make sure your column sections are assembled in chronological order, starting with the earliest event at the base.
